

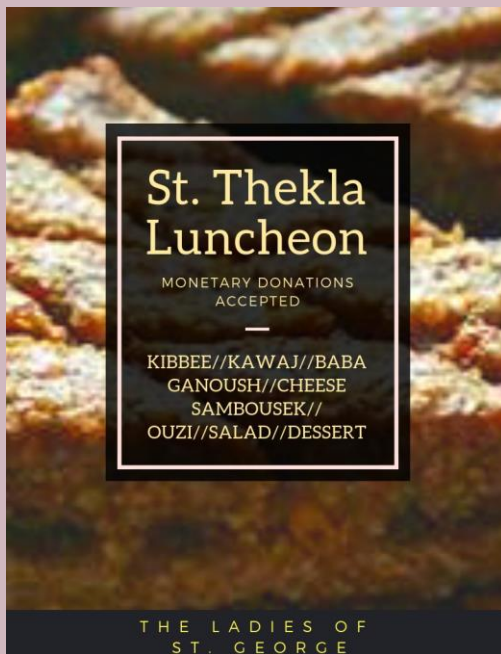

Great Job!, everyone who helped pack the clean-up buckets to help those whose homes were flooded by Hurricane Florence. Special thanks also to Brad Tingwald who drove the buckets to the collection center in Illinois. He reports that they were very happy to receive the buckets we put together, because they were completely depleted with what they've already given out in the Carolinas.

World Food Day is October 16 this year! This day is dedicated to tackle global hunger. People from around the world come together to declare their commitment to eradicate worldwide hunger! Our Archdiocese is committed to this program and encourages our participation! So as part of our participation in our Archdiocese's commitment to promote awareness and actions for those who suffer from hunger and to ensure food security and nutritious diet for all, we will be conducting six weeks **CANNED AND NON-PERISHABLE FOOD DRIVE** FOR our own FOOD PANTRY that first assist our own parishioners ,and others who are in need. We ask you to bring in canned goods and other non-perishable items. You can place them on the table in the main Lobby next to the elevators!

Please check the expiration date on the items you purchase and try to bring items whose expiration date is in late 2019 or after. PLEASE DO NOT BRING EXPIRED ITEMS. In order to keep the food pantry manageable, please bring only the following items:

• **October 14** Dried beans, canned vegetables* (PLEASE NO GREEN BEANS OR CORN, we have plenty of those two items in our pantry).

• **October 21** Canned meat, canned fruits, canned soups or broth, soda crackers

• **October 28** Peanut butter, jelly, breakfast bars, snack and/or protein bars

• **November 4** Spaghetti, pastas: dry or canned; spaghetti sauce, bread, salt, pepper, cooking oil

• **November 11** Small boxes of cold cereal, oatmeal, non-fat dried milk/powdered milk, Juice boxes

Would you please purchase some –not all- low sodium can goods, we would be grateful to you, as some people are on low sodium diet!

We report the total poundage received from the donations to the Archdiocese, but we keep the items for our own food pantry to help those in need (including parishioners), and if we have excess, we will donate to other local food pantries!

Last year we collected 502 lbs. due to your generous donations, let us all work together to exceed this number this year!

Coat Drive:

In conjunction with Holy Trinity, we are collecting **new and/or gently used coats** for the Embrace program at Eskenazi Hospital to help the Pink Ribbon Connection. Some of the breast cancer patients don't own coats to go to the hospital to receive their treatments.



If you would like you can also donate coats for Men and Children!
The coats collected for men will be donated to Wheeler Mission.
The coats collected for children will be donated to Brightwood Community Center!

Please note, we are collecting ONLY COATS this year!


CHRISTMAS CHOIR CONCERT "GOD IS WITH US"

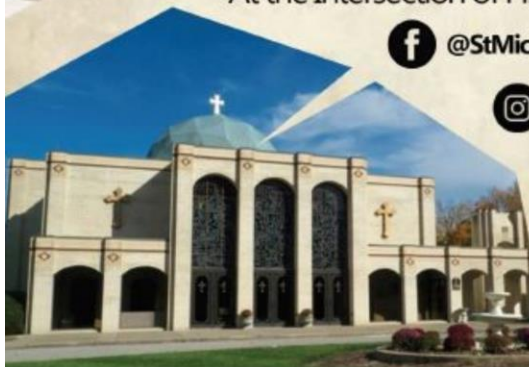
