Order for Holy Communion

Members of the Orthodox Church age seven and above must prepare for Holy Communion with a recent confession, prayer, fasting from all food and drink from midnight (unless medical condition preclude it), being in church *before* the Epistle and Gospel readings, and being at peace with everyone.

CHILDREN going to church school and their teachers should come down the center aisle first. (Small children may need to be assisted by their parents.)

ALL OTHERS should wait until an usher dismisses your row from the center aisle. Then return to your place by a side aisle for the prayers of thanksgiving and the final blessing and dismissal. Please let choir members pass when they come down for Communion.

A Warm Welcome to Our Guests

We are glad you are worshipping with us. Please note that participation in **Holy Communion is limited to members of the Orthodox Church** in good standing, who have prepared through prayer, fasting and confession.

For all others: though we cannot share Communion with you—since it is an expression of membership and full unity in faith—you are welcome to come forward after the dismissal, receive a blessing and partake of the blessed bread (from the large bowls). Please also sign our guest book, and introduce yourself to Fr. Nabil during the coffee hour. You may inquire with him how you can become a member.

Troparion of the Resurrection (Tone 1)

While the stone was sealed by the Jews....

Troparion for St. Euthymios (Tone 4)

Rejoice, barren wilderness! Be glad, sterile desert that has never known the travail of birth! The Man of desires, Euthymius, has multiplied your sons; He has planted them in

faith and piety. He has watered them with the Holy Spirit: They grow in self-denial and perfect virtue. Through his intercessions, Christ our God, preserve Your people in peace!

Troparion of St. George (Tone 4; Byzantine)

Liberator of captives, Defender of the poor, the Physician of the sick and the Champion of kings, O Trophy-bearer, Great-martyr

George, intercede with Christ our God that our souls be saved.

Kontakion of the Presentation of Christ (Tone 1)

O Christ God, Thou hast sanctified the virgin's womb by Thy birth, and as was meet, hast blessed the hands of Simeon. Thou hast also come to us to save us. Do Thou when

wars prevail, give peace to Thy people, and make mighty those whom Thou hast loved, for Thou alone art the Lover of mankind.

THE SCRIPTURE LESSONS

Prokeimenon (Psalm 149.5, 1 LXX; Tone 7)

The saints shall be joyful in glory.

Verse: Sing unto the Lord a new song!

2nd Epistle of Saint Paul to the Corinthians (4.6-15; St. Euthymios)

BRETHREN, it is the God Who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," Who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Christ.

But we have this treasure in earthen vessels, to show that the transcendent power belongs to God and not to us. We are afflicted

in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair; persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed; always carrying in the body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be manifested in our bodies. For while we live, we are always being given up to death for Jesus' sake, so that the life of Jesus

may be manifested in our mortal flesh. So, death is at work in us, but life in you.

Since we have the same spirit of faith as he had who wrote, "I believed, and so I spoke," we, too, believe, and so we speak, knowing

that He Who raised the Lord Jesus will raise us also with Jesus and bring us with you into His presence. For it is all for your sake, so that as grace extends to more and more people it may increase thanksgiving, to the glory of God.

Holy Gospel according to St. Luke (17.12-19; 12th Sunday of Luke)

AT THAT TIME, as Jesus entered a village, He was met by ten lepers, who stood at a distance and lifted up their voices and said, "Jesus, Master, have mercy on us." When He saw them, He said to them, "Go and show yourselves to the priests." And as they went they were cleansed. Then one of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back,

praising God with a loud voice; and he fell on his face at Jesus' feet, giving Him thanks. Now he was a Samaritan. Then said Jesus, "Were not ten cleansed? Where are the nine? Was no one found to return and give praise to God except this foreigner?" And He said to Him, "Rise, and go your way; your faith has made you well."

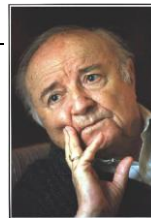


Please Join Us for Fellowship after the Liturgy

ANTIOCHIAN VILLAGE CAMP

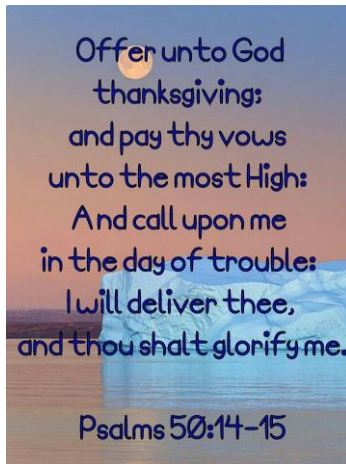
Camp is one of the most important aspects of our youth ministry. The programs at the Antiochian Village Camp fill up fast, and we don't want anyone left out. (Some children are *already* being put on the waiting list). *We hope every child age 9-17 will go to Camp. Our parish will be going to Session II, June 30-July 12, 2019.*

Our parish will help with \$600 of each child's camp tuition, which comes with a commitment on the part of the child/parents to help with fundraising to offset this expense. In the past, the church provided transportation. Note that it will now be up to the parents to carpool/vanpool their children to camp, since we have increased the camp scholarship amount, instead.
